Jessie Montes created his art entirely out of cardboard. Recycled boxes to be exact. Being a man of limited financial means this medium was perfect, it was plentiful and free! His first ventures in cardboard art were picture frames for his personal photos. Eventually, he began to fill the frames with his own cardboard creations. Jessie found cutting the cardboard at different angles produced different textures and colorations. These variations allowed Jessie to implement different visual effects adding interesting facets to his work. Finding the need for more color, Jessie incorporated acrylic paint into many of his creations. Montes' Mexican heritage and love for his adopted America really shine in this exhibition. Colors and designs are notably drawn from his Mexican roots, but subject matter tells viewers Montes deeply appreciated and respected the leadership and opportunities he found as an American citizen. These works are the epitome of creativity; they are exquisitely crafted and brilliantly artistic.
