Red & Green Quilts

On loan from the Rocky Mountain Quilt Museum in Golden, Colorado.

Dating from 1835 to the early 20th century, this quilt collection shows off the popular red and green color combinations of the era, including the costly

Turkey Red, imported from Europe.

Quilts were often made before marriage and placed on a bed or the baby's crib. Some of the best quilts would be made after the children left home, then placed proudly on display in the front room or atop a guest bed.

Several varieties of quilt patterns are featured in the exhibit, including the "Turkey Tracks" pattern. Originally known as "Wandering Foot", the pattern has a history laden with superstitions and myths from the colonial era.

Courtesy of the Rocky Mountain Quilt Museum (Golden, CO), this 25-quilt collection holds prime examples of a beautiful era in our quilting history.

After 12 years in the advertising market of Los Angeles, Allen and Patty Eckman left their stressful careers to explore a whole new side of art: cast paper sculpturing.

Inspired by his heritage, Allen's great-great-great-grandmother was named Tounacha-Cherokee Case. This link, coupled with Allen's fascination for Native American materials and history, nourishes his passion to sculpt.



Wildlife, birds, and flowers capture Patty's interest. "When I look at a flower, I don't just see color – I see form and grace." Patty's attention to nature joins beautifully with Allen's passion, and results in exquisitely detailed sculptures.

Both of them remain deeply inspired by Native American culture and often work together on their larger, more complicated sculptures.

Allen & Patty Eckman are internationally recognized as some of the only masters in this medium.

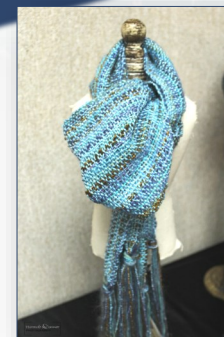
As you stroll through the gallery, enjoy the new dimension created by the imagination and talent of these young artists and their instructors.
