

JOE KIRKENDALL Phillipsburg, KS Wood Lathed Items Like many objects rooted in the everyday, quilts have the capacity to communicate stories about the context in which they were made and used. They represent maps of the quilters' lives—living records of cultural traditions, rites of passage, relationships, political and spiritual beliefs, landmark events, and future aspirations. In the same way, a map is a pocket-sized abstraction of the world beyond what can be seen; in a quilt, a maker's choice of fabric and design reveals insights into the



topography of their world and place within it.

The quilts in Handstitched Worlds: The Cartography of Quilts read like roadmaps revealing places of origin and paths to understanding. Pieces such as "The Abraham Lincoln Flag Quilt," and "Contrary to Hearsay: He Wasn't the Devil" commemorate historical events. The quilt "In Honor Shall Waves Spread" includes a depiction of a 1902 workers' strike. History is also told through a piece

like "Soldier's Quilt" which was quilted out of military uniforms probably during a British soldier's downtime while in India. It was most likely a man that made this quilt which contradicts previously held perceptions of quilters.

Handstitched Worlds features 18 quilts from the collection of the American Folk Art Museum in New York and toured by International Arts & Artists, Washington, DC.



Crocodilian Scratchboards

by John Agnew explores crocodilians as studies in texture and form. Agnew likes the scratch technique for its affinity to the engravings in the early texts about zoology, and its ability to treat the species in exquisite detail. The contrast of black and white lines is well suited for showing off intimate details of the crocodile's scaly texture. Intimate portraits, plus scenes from daily crocodilian life and even interactions with humans are all subjects explored in this exhibition. Come explore the crocodilian habitat through the eyes of Agnew at the Hansen Museum May 19 through June 25.






