Super heroes and LEGO® bricks are a winning combination! Acclaimed artist, Sean Kenney, certainly hit the jackpot when he came up with the idea to highlight the super powers of animals by making them into sculptures with the world's most recognized toy brick. In our current exhibition, **Animal Super Powers**, Kenney used over a million LEGO® bricks to make the 26 larger-than-life animal sculptures on display. Combining his expertise as a cartoonist with meticulous blueprints, Kenney puts a



playful spin on traditional art to make jaw dropping sculptures.

Kenney's menagerie of animals has received a warm welcome at the Hansen Museum. Young and old alike are completely in awe as soon as they step through the door. All featured animals possess a superhero-like skill whether it is a physical characteristic or an adaptive ability, and they are all sculpted with ordinary LEGO® bricks.

Each sculpture has signage describing the animal's super power which also includes the total number of bricks used to make the sculpture and the number of hours it took to build. Visitors are fascinated with the information—both the science and stats. They are simultaneously amazed and educated!

So far, almost every visitor has taken a seat at the play table before leaving the exhibition. After finding inspiration in Kenney's dazzling sculptures, guests are ready to create! Animals, cars, planes, buildings, and more have all been built. There have even been a couple of progressive "community projects" built on the play table. On view through September 10th, the excitement of super heroes and LEGO® bricks awaits you at the **Animal Super Powers** exhibition on view at the Hansen Museum.

In the first 16 days of being open to the public, 1,020 visitors have come to view Sean Kenney's LEGO® brick animals. It has been so exciting to see young and old alike completely taken with these non-traditional sculptures. Kenney's work will remain on view through September 10<sup>th</sup>; please make plans to come see his take on super heroes.

Our adaptation of the library's story hour program, **Art Time for Kids** also kept things popping during July. We offered structured lessons with movement to give little ones a lively introduction to the Museum and basic art concepts. This year the children learned about scratchboards, abstract concepts, patterns, and super heroes! All the lessons were wonderful fun, but the last session when the children drew themselves as super heroes was a raving success.

As August rushes in, we are finalizing details for the Hansen Museum's 49<sup>th</sup> Annual Arts and Crafts Fair on Saturday, Aug. 19<sup>th</sup>. We have many new crafters, returning favorites, fantastic artisans, delectable food vendors, fabulous entertainment, and inflatable fun. This year we are proud to host a fabulous bluegrass group with local ties on the North stage. The Bent Fork Band is a family of highly skilled musicians who harmonize beautifully. Forty-nine



years and counting, the Arts and Craft Fair is an annual event looked forward to by many.

Moving into September, the Hansen Museum will host its Labor Day Celebration on Sunday, Sept. 3<sup>rd</sup>. Another time-honored tradition, 2023 is the 45<sup>th</sup> annual celebration. 

#### **Birds in Art**

The 47<sup>th</sup> annual "Birds in Art" exhibition opens on Friday, September 22, at the Hansen Museum. The exhibit, one of the most prestigious exhibits of wildlife art in the world, features art created by 118 artists. It will be on view through November 5. "Birds in Art" 2022 is replete with birds strutting, vocalizing, socializing, preening, and soaring. This year, 570 artists submitted 946 artworks for consideration by the three-person jury. **NEXT EXHIBIT:** 

Of the 118 selected artists, 95 were chosen by the jury in addition to 23 who were named Master Artists during previous "Birds in Art" exhibitions. Thirty-three are international, representing 15 different countries.

In addition to paintings in watercolor, oil, and acrylic; sculptures in stone, wood, wire, aluminum, and bronze; and drawings in graphite, pastel, chalk, and charcoal, the exhibition includes various mediums – from cut paper and scratchboard to serigraphy, woodcut, linocut, and etching. Textile art is included from two first-time artists: Jim Hay, from Japan, who incorporated machinesewn kimono into his whimsical work, and Canadian Sue Sherman. whose quilt depicts three Monk Parakeets.

**Quilt Class Orientation** will be held Tuesday, September 26. Classes will then be held every Tuesday, October 3 -November 7 from 6:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. in the **Museum Community** Room. Students supply all materials and necessary sewing equipment. Instructor: Janie Lowry from Stockton, KS can assist all levels of guilters with this pattern (Woven Half Square Triangle Quilt) or any quilting project.





Join instructor Laurie Albin as she introduces basic watercolor techniques for the beginner and goes 'beyond the basics' for the intermediate painter. Instruction will be geared for each participant's personal growth during this two-day workshop. A fun learning environment where ideas are shared in a positive manner.

Students are required to bring their own paints and brushes. Watercolor paper will be provided.
