**EXHIBIT:** on display through January 28 **NOTORIOUS** Kansas' history is filled with colorful characters that have shaped the state we know today. Among those people, one can find a wide variety of individuals whose actions range from noble to downright despicable. Through the passage of time, perspectives change, and reality can give way to legend. Lines begin to blur exactly who truly deserves the title NOTORIOUS.

Several of the individuals highlighted in this exhibit impacted the history of our State. Women like Clarina Nichols laid the groundwork for women's suffrage and hurled Kansas to the forefront of the national women's rights movement. Nichols' tenacity helped earn women constitutional rights such

as child custody and property rights for married women. In 1867, other advocates such as Susan B. Anthony and Lucy Stone joined Nichols' fight for women's rights eventually earning them the right to vote in Kansas in 1912—seven years before the United States passed the 19<sup>th</sup> Amendment.

Although controversial, John Brown, another individual highlighted, remains an important historical figure. Some considered Brown to be delusional, others thought he was a pawn of political extremism, but one would be hard pressed to question his leadership during the battles of Bleeding Kansas. Brown's fierce abolitionism heightened the debate about slavery in the United States. No matter one's thoughts on Brown himself, it would be hard to deny him the title "NOTORIOUS".

The work of notable figures in Kansas history like Clarina Nichols and John Brown helped shape the great State of Kansas. It is important for today's citizens to follow their lead, fight the good fights, correct





the wrongs, and prepare for tomorrow. The NOTORIOUS exhibit is not only historical, but it is also inspirational. Reviewing the past pushes one to consider the future. Remembering those that made positive contributions to Kansas reminds us that profound change does not just happen. These folks were purpose driven and intentional in their actions.

From naughty to nervy, noble to nefarious, this exhibit introduces visitors to 13 unforgettable historical Kansas characters. The individuals are profiled under three categories: Legend vs. Reality, How Passage of Time Alters Perspective, and Lasting Impact on Society. After exploring these so-called notorious figures, visitors can decide for themselves if such a title is deserved.

The primary goal of our summer programs expose children to all genres of art in an enjoyable and inspiring manner. The past two years, we have had parents and grandparents calling the Museum in December to sign children up the for next year's summer programs.

2024 promises to be just as incredible as 2023. The Museum will host six wonderful exhibitions and currently has twenty-five Continuing Education Classes/Workshops covering a wide range of disciplines scheduled (hopefully you received your *Looking Into 2024* trifold in the mail). Several special events are on the calendar including the 50th anniversary of the Hansen Museum's Annual Arts and Crafts Fair. Watch for special programming at this year's fair on August 17<sup>th</sup>.

Of the six phenomenal exhibitions planned, let me bend your ear about two. Opening May 31<sup>st</sup>, Sonic Sensation –the Science of Sound is a fully immersive and interactive exhibition that explores sound. Visitors will be able to experiment with pitch, test their hearing, make a movie





soundtrack, step into a Scream Chamber to see how many decibels their roar can produce, and more!

Da Vinci The Exhibition debuts at the Hansen on August 11<sup>th</sup>. A handson exploration of the life and work of the original Renaissance man, Leonardo da Vinci. This traveling exhibition features over 60 inventions and machines brought to life from da Vinci's codices, advanced anatomical studies, world-renowned paintings, and so much more.

In the spirit of our namesake, the late Dane G. Hansen, the Museum strives to innovatively enrich the lives of the people of Northwest Kansas by being a place where children and adults can escape into a place of cultural enlightenment, through the power of art.


