EXHIBIT: on display through May 26 ART AND THE ANIMAL is the 63rd Annual Members Exhibition of the Society of Animal Artists (SAA). Currently, the SAA has over 500 members residing in 25 countries. Today, the Society's membership is a virtual Who's Who of international animal artists. To be included in the annual exhibition SAA members go through a highly competitive juried process to have their work included in the annual exhibition. Consequently, it is extremely difficult, and therefore prestigious, for artists to have artwork accepted into the exhibition.

This year, the traveling exhibition features 45 flatworks and 15 sculptures by as many artists. On view is a number of species:

from house cats to cheetahs, dairy cows to zebras, snakes, bears, dogs, birds, and the list goes on. The choices of style and medium are equally varied. Artworks portray animals from both exotic and familiar places, revealing the rich diversity of creatures that inhabit our planet.

In their mission to promote artistic excellence in the portrayal of animals, the SAA aims to broaden appreciation for the natural world. Viewers will discover wild and domestic creatures, great and small, on land, sea, and air, in a wide range of media and artistic expression. You do not have to be a fine art connoisseur to appreciate this exhibition—it has a far-reaching appeal. **ART AND THE ANIMAL** is an impressive collection of fine art only available in Kansas at the Hansen Museum.

Noted wildlife art scholar and author of American Wildlife Art, Dr. David J. Wagner, serves as Tour Director for Art and the Animal.

Back by popular demand is the Hansen Museum's STEM Camp, June 11th – 13th with Brad Schmolesky. This year's theme is Brickmania Agriculture and Animal Care and will be at the Museum June 17th – 21st.
