Visitors can experience our sonic world while exploring thirteen interactive learning stations. Learn about the anatomy and physics of how we hear, find out about decibels, amplitude, frequency, pitch, and sound waves. Learn how you hear and discover how well you can listen.

soundproof chamber, close the door, and let out a scream! A partner reads the decibel meter mounted on the outside of the chamber. Compare that to other sounds on a chart. Can you scream as loud as a howler monkey? The competition gets fierce and funny real fast!

UPCOMING: DA VINCI THE EXHIBITION


THE HANSEN MUSEUM is excited to announce *Da Vinci The Exhibition* will be on view from August 11 through November 10, 2024. The exhibit follows the Renaissance master, Leonardo da Vinci, on a journey of innovation, creativity, science, and wonder.

Developed by Aurea Exhibitions and produced by Imagine Exhibitions, Inc., Da Vinci The Exhibition is a hands-on examination of da Vinci's life, research, and art. Featuring fully built, life-size inventions, fine art studies, and dozens of stunning displays, guests will learn the complex beginnings and lifetime achievements of da Vinci through his discoveries in art, engineering, flight, hydraulics, music, light, science, and more.

Each invention featured in *Da Vinci The Exhibition* was handcrafted utilizing a modern translation of da Vinci's unique mirrored writing style in an ancient Florentine dialect. Trained artisans used these translations to construct full-scale models and bring the master's two-dimensional plans to life.

In addition to da Vinci's role as an inventor, the exhibition investigates a collection of da Vinci's most renowned paintings, including some controversial works traditionally attributed to him but not yet authenticated. Guests will have the opportunity to thoroughly study the artistic mastery behind such works as "Mona Lisa," "The Last Supper," "Portrait of a Young Man," "Virgin of the Rocks," "St. John the Baptist," and more.


